## Innovation-supported regional development in Saxony and other European regions - an example of the Talent Booster mechanism

On January 17, 2023, the European Commission adopted a communication on the subject of "Harnessing Talent in Europe's Regions". The responsible Vice-President and Commissioner for Democracy and Demography, **Dubravka Šuica**, uses this event as an opportunity to present the paper to the public and to initiate parts of the Talent Booster mechanism created with the communication.

Saxony has already advanced solutions for innovation-supported regional development in advance. Regional Development Minister **Thomas Schmidt** launched the simul<sup>+</sup>InnovationHub, a platform that brings together citizens and stakeholders from research, business, the state and municipalities. The initiative bundles knowledge, skills and resources to initiate projects that address the challenges of our time such as digitization, climate protection, demographic change and the creation of equal living conditions in town and countryside. The hub is based on three pillars: knowledge transfer, competition for innovative ideas and support for pilot projects. Under the umbrella of simul<sup>+</sup>, people from all over Saxony come together and develop and exchange ideas to make their region attractive and worth living in for talented people.

Other European regions will also present their promising strategies at the event. The event is the starting point for the dissemination of good practices between regions, one of the pillars of the Talent Booster mechanism, which is central to the communication.
